ARIA is committed to improving the profile and representation of women in international arbitration and to increase the number of women appointed as arbitrators on an equal opportunity basis. To aid in achieving this goal, ARIA will publish a Special All-Women’s Issue. ARIA invites women international arbitration practitioners, arbitrators, academics, and other professionals to submit original articles for consideration.

ARIA is a quarterly law review that publishes scholarly articles, commentaries, case notes, and other works relating to international arbitration. It is the only publication of its kind in the United States, a leading publication in the international arbitration field globally, and one of the most cited international arbitration law journals in the world. ARIA hopes to showcase the wide expertise of women practitioners and scholars. To this end, article topics are completely up to the authors, so long as the topic discusses international arbitration.

SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

If you are interested in submitting an article for consideration, please submit your work **no later than March 31, 2019**. Submissions should be addressed to Student Editors-in-Chief Kate Joohyun Lee and Ernesto M. Hernández at ARIA@law.columbia.edu. Late submissions will not be considered for ARIA’s Special All-Women’s Issue but may be considered for publication in a standard issue. The expected publication will be sometime in late May 2019.

- The article (or a very similar version of the article) must not have already been published.
- Subject of submission email must read “**Special Issue – [Author(s) Surname(s)]**”
- Article should be 5,000 to 7,500 words (including footnotes).
- Article must include a Table of Contents and a one-paragraph abstract on the first page (not counted towards word limit).
- Citations must conform to the most recent edition of *The Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citations*.
